

The Day of the Lord

- In general terms, the Day of the Lord refers to a special or unique time when God's power and holiness are unveiled, bringing terror and death to His enemies.
- The Day of the Lord is a prophetic term that primarily speaks of the supernatural outpouring of God's judgment on Israel, the Gentile nations, or both.
- The Day of the Lord never refers to a literal day but is used figuratively to refer to a period of time much as John uses hour in the phrase "the hour of His judgment has come" (Revelation 14:7)


- who opposes and exalts himself against every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of 4. God, proclaiming himself to be God.


 Do you not remember that when I was still with you I told you

- in order that all may be condemned who did not believe the truth but had pleasure in unrighteousness.




- 1. Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers, you have no need to have anything written to you.

- 3. While people are saying, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and they will not escape.






Luke 21:25-28



Abortion Statistics: Year ended December 2019

Some key facts. In 2019:

- 12,857 induced abortions were performed in New Zealand, down from the highest figure of 18,511 in 2003.
- the general abortion rate was <u>13.1 abortions per 1,000 women</u> aged 15–44 years, down slightly from 13.7 per 1,000 in 2018
- most abortions (64%) were a woman's first (36% not the first)
- 18 percent of known pregnancies (live births, stillbirths, and abortions) ended in an abortion.

You'd think that a global pandemic that's killed hundreds of thousands would at least temper the advance of legal killing. It hasn't. While headlines worldwide were praising New Zealand's prime minister for her handling of COVID-19, she was working to pass what might be described as the most extreme abortion laws on the planet. In late March, New Zealand's parliament voted, in the words of the New York Times, to "loosen" the nation's abortion laws, particularly in the latter half of pregnancy when babies become viable outside of the womb. "Loosen" may be the understatement of the decade.

According to the New York Times article, "public opinion surveys show that most New Zealanders" favored liberalizing their country's abortion laws. However, independent polling shows that the vast majority oppose specific features in this law. For instance, just 2 percent of Kiwi women support abortion on-demand up to birth. 93 percent oppose sex-selective abortion, in which a child is killed for no other reason than his or her sex. And, 94 percent of women polled support longstanding legal standards for New Zealand's abortion providers. In other words, they didn't want them relaxed at all. Perhaps the unpopularity of abortion-on-demand-forany-reason-whatsoever is why pro-abortion politicians in New Zealand felt the need to rush through this legislation while everyone was distracted by a global pandemic.
