- 19. for there must be factions among you in order that ... or ... SO THAT ... those who are genuine among you may be recognized.


verse 19 (Amplified Bible)

verse 19 (Kenneth Wuest N/T Translation) For it is a necessity in the nature of the case also for factions to be among you, in order that also those who have been put to the test and have met the specifications and have been approved might become identified as such among you.



The terms ecumenism and ecumenical come from the Greek οἰκουμένη (oikoumene), which means "the whole inhabited world", and was historically used with specific reference to the Roman Empire. The ecumenical vision comprises both the search for the visible unity of the Church (Ephesians 4:3) and the "whole inhabited earth" (Matthew 24:14) as the concern of all Christians.



Interfaith describes an interaction between people of different religions or faith traditions. But it is more than that. It is about understanding our significant differences, but recognizing our similarities, and working together for peace, justice and healing in our world.

Interfaith is not about renouncing religions, or combining all religions into one. Interfaith creates a space for all religious, faith and spiritual traditions to be celebrated.


One of the major goals of the New Age Movement is to create a Universal Religious System with all historic doctrinal distinctions removed.
