## Mark 12:41-44

41. Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts.
42. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents.
43. Calling His disciples to Him, Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others.
44. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on.



The two mites of the widow were, in Christ's eyes, worth more than all the other money cast into the treasury, for "she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living."

## **Zechariah 4:10**


For even someone who doesn't think much of a day when such minor events take place will rejoice.

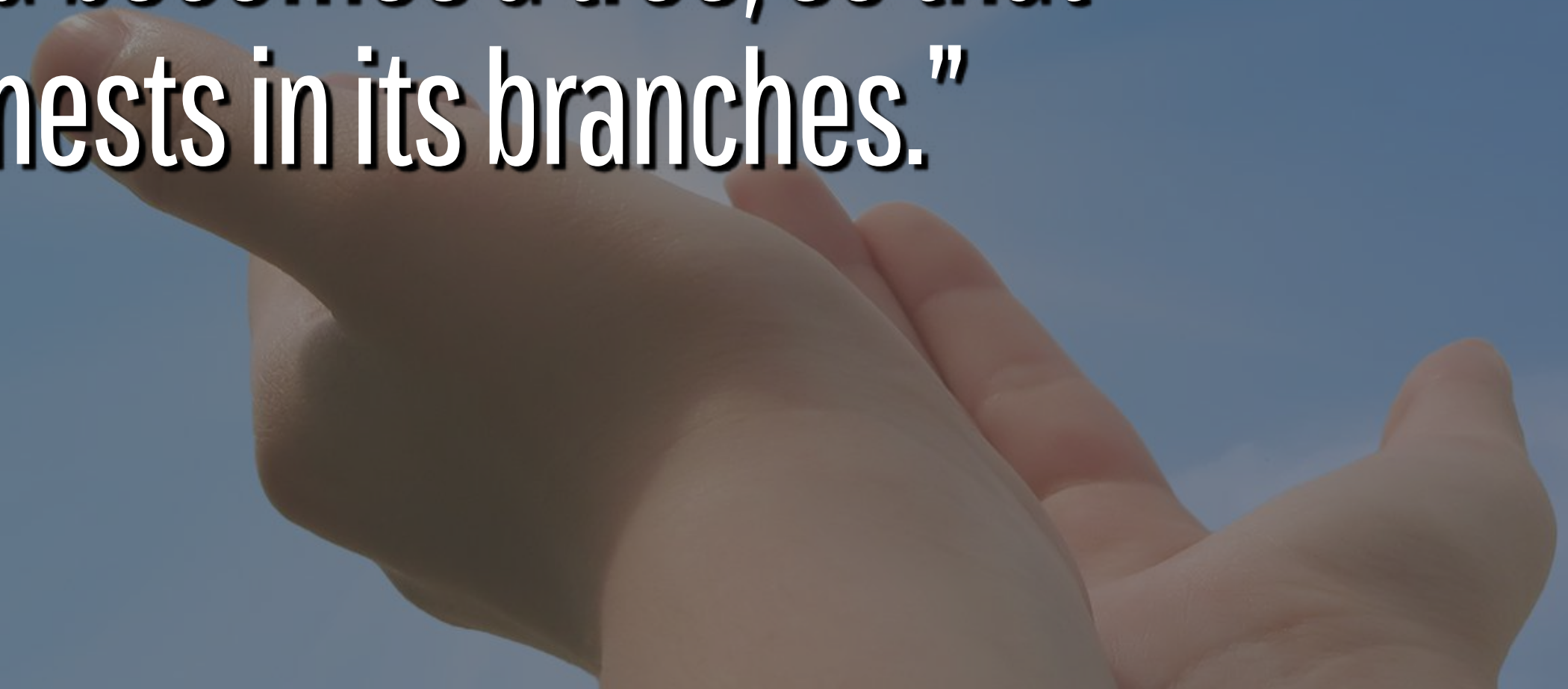




## Matthew 13:31-32

32. It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches."






**Matthew 25:** The Final Judgement of God and the blessings of the Kingdom when:
