- we WANT to guard our redeemed hearts so we can have a very real relationship and not be distanced from God Psalm 51:11

We cannot afford to be cut off from He Who sustains us. None of us have been this way before, we need the daily, continual guidance of the Holy Spirit. And we must have full confidence that our prayers are aligned to His will and have full confidence that our line of communication is clear from the static interference of any known sin. So we watch over our hearts with all vigilance and diligence.

Mounce's Expository Dictionary

- * keeping oneself fully devoted to Christ and the Christian way of life
- The "BE-Attitude" is not striving to avoid sin. It is striving to be fully devoted to Jesus

Looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.
