- Does it really matter ... if the theology of some of what is sung in Christian "worship" music doesn't fit with Scripture, that the lyrics of some songs are theologically inaccurate?




When we presume we can know what will please God, without having first listened to what he's said in His Word, the god we are aiming to please is not the true God.
