

THE AGE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

- The Age of the Holy Spirit refers to the period after Jesus' ascension and before His return, marked by the Holy Spirit's active role in guiding, empowering and sanctifying believers.
- The Age of the Holy Spirit is the age of the Church and is characterised by the ongoing work of salvation, the experience of Pentecost with the Holy Spirit actively working to build and shape the community of believers.

THE AGE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

- The Age of the Holy Spirit is a period of anticipation for the second coming of Christ as the Bridegroom for His Bride. Today, the Holy Spirit is preparing believers for that future event.
- The Age of the Holy Spirit in which we are now living, is an age where Jesus is no longer with us in bodily form, but in a new way- in the presence of the Holy Spirit.

THE AGE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit is the operational member of the Godhead in the earth today, in this Age of the Holy Spirit. That means that while Jesus, the Head of the Church, is absent in bodily form because He is at the right hand of the Father, Jesus is present with us by the presence of the Holy Spirit & Jesus is with us by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The work of the Spirit in the Church is set forth in the promises of Jesus on the eve of His departure, and demonstrated in the Acts of the Apostles. The Gospels "tell of all that Jesus began to do and to teach, until the day in which He was received up," and the Acts of the Apostles tell of all that He continued to do and to teach after the day in which He was received up. The Holy Spirit is the active, administrative Agent of the glorified Son. He is the Paraclete, the Deputy, the acting Representative of the Ascended Christ.

Theologians call this doctrine "Pneumatology."
The term is essentially derived from two Greek words: pneuma and logos. Pneuma means "breath" or "spirit." Logos means "word" or "doctrine." So, pneumatology is "the word of the Spirit" or "the doctrine of the Spirit."



The Doctrine of the Trinity


The doctrine of the Trinity teaches that there is one God who eternally exists as three distinct Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Stated differently, there is one God, but this one God exists as three distinct Persons within one divine being.

These definitions express three crucial truths:

- The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are distinct Persons
- Each Person is fully God
- There is only one God


THE TRINITY

The Deity of the Holy Spirit

- seen in the following Divine Attributes

- The Holy Spirit is **OMNIPOTENT** (unlimited in power)
- The Holy Spirit is **OMNIPRESENT** (everywhere at all times)
- The Holy Spirit is **OMNISCIENT** (unlimited in knowledge & wisdom)
- The Holy Spirit is **HOLY** (in nature & essence)
- The Holy Spirit is **ETERNAL** (without beginning or end)
- The Holy Spirit is **LIFE** (originator of life, the Spirit of Life)
- The Holy Spirit is **TRUTH** (inherently truth, free of any falsehood)

The Divine Works of the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit:

- was involved in Creation
- was involved in bringing forth the Messiah
- inspired men to write the Scriptures
- is involved in the work of regeneration (new birth)
- imparts new life to those who are saved
- is involved in the ongoing work of sanctification
- is the One that Jesus baptises believers in





- PERSONHOOD is a term relating to the existence of features which indicate someone is a someone rather than merely something.
- PERSONHOOD is defined as the quality or state of being a person.
- A PERSON, in turn, is characterised by possessing intellect, emotion, and will.
- The Holy Spirit possesses all three of these attributes & none of these characteristics are found in an impersonal force.

Intellect

- Isaiah 11:2: the Holy Spirit has knowledge and wisdom and provides counsel and understanding.
- John 14:26: The Holy Spirit teaches the believers and brings to remembrance all that Jesus has said.
- John 15:26, Romans 8:16: the Holy Spirit bears witness of the Messiah.
- ► I Corinthians 2:10-13: the Holy Spirit knows the thoughts of God and teaches truth.
- Ephesians 1:17: it is the Holy Spirit who gives wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of God.

Emotions

- Isaiah 63:10: the Holy Spirit has the ability to grieve.
- Romans 15:30: the Holy Spirit can love.
- Ephesians 4:30 repeats that the Holy Spirit experiences grief.
- Thessalonians 5:19: the Holy Spirit can be quenched.

Throughout the book of Acts, the Holy Spirit is portrayed as actively guiding Paul and the apostles, sometimes in rather dramatic ways.

- Acts 16:6-10: the Holy Spirit can forbid things.
- ► I Corinthians 12:11: The Holy Spirit distributes the gifts as He wills.
- Acts 13:2: While they were ministering to the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

The Holy Spirit Performs the Works of a Person

The Holy Spirit:

- creates
- restrains sin
- empowers
- teaches
- comforts
- guides & leads
- convicts

- testifies & witnesses
- issues orders
- performs miracles
- sends
- speaks
- prays & intercedes

A biblical pneumatology rests on the belief that the Holy Spirit is neither a presence nor a power, but a person of the triune Godhead.

The Church still has a theology of the Holy Spirit, but it has no living consciousness of His presence and power. Theology without experience is like faith without works: it is dead. The signs of death abound. Prayer-meetings have died out because men did not believe in the Holy Spirit. The liberty of prophesying has gone because men believe in investigation and not in inspiration. There is a dearth of conversions because faith about the New Birth as a creative act of the Holy Spirit has lost its grip on intellect and heart. The experience of the Second Gift of Grace is no longer preached and testified, because Christian experience, though it may have to begin in the Spirit, must be perfected in the wisdom of the flesh and the culture of the schools.


